

## **Private Part Rules (For Preschool Children)**

1. No touching other people's private parts. (This includes kicking, hitting, biting, etc.).
2. No other people touching your private parts.
3. No showing private parts to other people. (or Keep your clothes on when other people can see you).
4. Touching your own private parts when you are alone is ok. (or No touching private parts in public).
